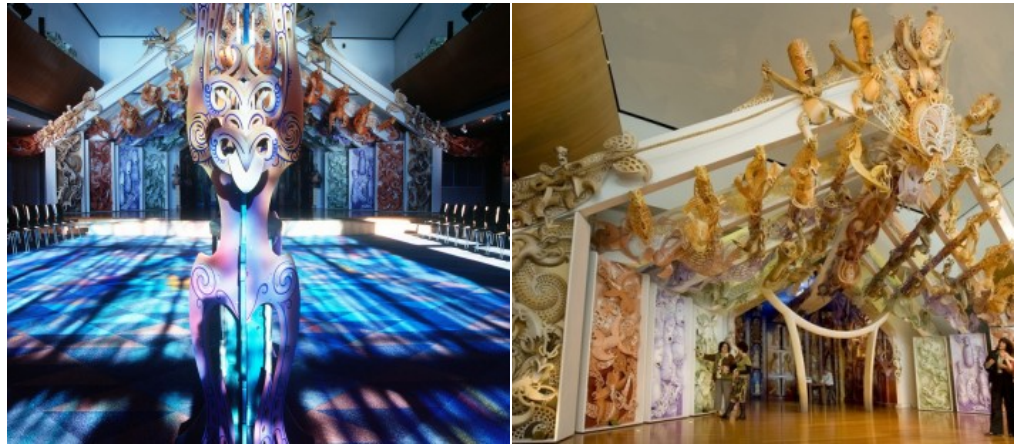


Te Papa is New Zealand's national museum, an innovative modern museum that is as entertaining as it is scholarly. Centrally located on the waterfront it is Wellington's number one attraction. Te Papa hosts superb special exhibitions as well as having an outstanding collection of early Maori artifacts, fascinating displays of early European settlements, geology and social history. The collections span art, history, Pacific, Māori, and natural environment.

Te Papa is internationally recognised for the way it works together with the cultural protocols and customs of the indigenous Maori people of Aotearoa New Zealand.



General Entry

Free entry, though charges apply to some short-term exhibitions and activities.
